

This is how the International Genesee Valley Quiz Night works

The quiz will take place in the barn at The Shire at 3089 Avon Road. This is a fundraiser and the net proceeds will be shared between The Genesee Valley Hunt and The Genesee Valley Conservancy.

Bring a writing instrument; we'll provide the paper. Bring your own table and chairs; and your own wine if you prefer. You may come and set up your table from midday on Friday, June 24th.

The bar will open and supper will be served at 6:00 pm. The quiz starts at 7:00 sharp.

A team can consist of up to eight people. The first thing you do is take your completed team form up to Registration Control along with any money that you owe. Remember, you have already paid to be there, but if your team numbers exceed 4 you will have to pay an extra \$15 for every single member of your team unless they are all under 16 years old.

It is important that you do this as soon as possible after arriving. It is the only way to get to see the picture quiz on which you will want to make a start during supper. Some of the images are easy, others will be difficult and the points make up a good proportion of the whole score for the evening.

The Quiz Masters will have devised some 80 questions roughly split into eight very diverse categories. Among them might be sport, pop music, science and literature, to name but a few.

After each round you will swap papers with the table next door and the Quiz Masters will announce the answers. (This is not a democracy and their decision is final. Arguments about the correct answer will be conducted at the bar at the end of the quiz) As soon as your paper has been marked take it up to the scorers for the result to be added to the board. Before the next round begins the current leaders will be announced.

Remember your participation in the quiz can only happen if you have sent in your reservation form and payment to Janice Barrett. Remember too, there is a deadline for applications. Those that are received after June 10th have to make a larger donation. The details are on the form.

And one final piece of advice: diversity breeds success. A table with a mixture of ages and skills will have a greater chance of answering all the questions.
