## DAMAGE IN HUNT TERRITORY

If a gate, coop or fence is damaged during a hunt, please report the damage and the location to Travis Thorne (cell phone 451-8132) as soon as possible after the hunt. If the damage is in a fence surrounding a pasture inhabited by livestock, do not leave without securing the barrier to hold the livestock until a permanent repair can be made following the hunt.

## BUTTON REQUIREMENTS

In general, those to be considered for the button list should have hunted for a minimum of three seasons and been recognized to have proper behavior in the hunt field.

Junior contributors should not be considered for their buttons until they are at least 18 years old. Please report the birth dates of junior contributors to the Hunt secretary (243-3949 or e-mail [gvhunt@frontiernet.net](mailto:gvhunt@frontiernet.net)).

## A HUNTING WE WILL GO!

The Hunt Staff has been busy this spring walking, exercising and training the Genesee Valley Hounds and new entry for the upcoming season. It's looking like a great season ahead!

**Hound jogging** is scheduled to begin around July 1. Continue to check the recorded message at 585-243-2606. Once hound jogging opens, hounds will depart from the Kennels on Roots Tavern Rd. at 6:00 a.m. Monday - Saturday. Hound jogging is open to subscribers and guests, but all participants must have a waiver on file.

Generally, there is one week of hunting FOR STAFF ONLY between hound jogging and the start of cub hunting. This year, staff hunting is expected to be the week of July 18.

**Cub Hunting** is *tentatively* expected to begin Saturday, July 23 and will extend through the month of September. During cub hunting,

hounds will go out Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. Formal attire is not required. Please check the recorded message at 585-243-2606 to confirm cub hunting has begun, and for the time and location of each meet. GVH contributors and capping guests are welcome to cub hunt.

**The Opening Meet of the Formal Season** is October 1. This meet gathers at The Homestead and begins with a parade down Genesee's Main Street. Only contributors may hunt on Opening Day. (Contributions should be paid in full by September 15 unless other arrangements have been made with the Secretary.) Formal attire is required from Opening Meet through the end of November.

## CAPPING FEES

Guests of Genesee Valley Hunt contributing members are welcome to cap up to three times during the hunting season. Adult capping fees for 2005 remain at \$75 on weekends and \$50 on weekdays.

Cappers and those members bringing a guest are asked to call and inform the Hunt Secretary (585-243-3949) prior to the meet. At the meet, present the cap and waiver in an envelope labeled with the name and address of the capper and date of the meet.

Cappers must sign a new waiver each year.

## AIDAN O'CONNELL CLINICS

Our Irish friend, Aidan O'Connell will return **September 30 to October 9** to provide cross-country, stadium and coops clinics. Many GVH foxhunters have taken Aidan's cross-country and coops clinics and appreciated the emphasis he puts on techniques to ride and jump more safely. He also helps instill confidence in both the horse and rider.

Here are some comments from fellow GVH foxhunters who have taken his clinics:

## THE MASTER'S CUP

"The idea of the Master's Cup is to recognize a horse of all around excellence for use in our hunting community, and at the same time, to encourage owners to school their horses in matters that are most important to the pleasure of their owners (and other members of the field) while hunting," wrote William P. Wadsworth in a letter to the secretary of the Long Lake Hounds Hunt in 1970.

Master's Cup records at the Hunt office date back to 1958 (winners listed on opposite page). The system by which the winner of the Master's Cup is chosen has been modified from time to time over the years, but the goal has always been to identify the type of horse W.P. describes in the above paragraph.

A contributor's horse becomes eligible for the Master's Cup by completing the GVH Horse Trials. Horse Trials points are then calculated by subtracting the horse's total trials score from a maximum Master's Cup point level designated for each division as follows:

- Foxhunters and Beg. Novice Divisions - 200 points
- Novice Division - 400 points
- Training Division - 500 points
- Preliminary Division - 600 points
- Intermediate Division - 700 points

Horses can then accumulate points throughout the season as follows:

Racing over fences & Point-to-Point (not to include pace races) - 100 points for a first place finish, 90 points for a second place finish, 80 for third and 50 points if horse finishes with the rider.

Hunting - 30 points per hunt for each hunt the horse was present and stayed out until the hounds start home (or close to the whole hunt). A maximum of 500 points can be accumulated (17 hunts). **Owners who want their horses considered for the Master's Cup must present a list of the hunting dates for which the horse qualified for hunting points to the hunt secretary by Nov. 1.**

Special Test - horses accumulating the most points will be invited to participate in a special test designed by the Masters to test the training and obedience of the ideal hunt horse. (Outline of test shown below.) This test offers the opportunity to score up to 550 additional points.

Final scores are tallied and winner announced at the Master's Cup tea which follows the Master's Test.

Interested in giving it a try? If you haven't entered the Horse Trials yet, you need to do that immediately. Call Janice for entry information.

### Master's Cup Special Test

#### 1) Back off trail into brush.

**Stand for 30 seconds.**

- Back without resistance (15 points)
- Back in a straight line (5 points)
- Stand still (5 points)

**TOTAL 25 points**

#### 2) To permit rider to dismount, and lead over obstacle. (20 seconds allowed time)

- Lead over quietly, safely & promptly without displacing obstacle. (40 points)
- Stand quietly while rider mounts. (10 points)

**TOTAL 50 points (minus time penalty)**

#### 3) Open, pass through and close gate. Form and time to count. (15 seconds allowed time)

- Stand quietly parallel to gate, heels to hinge while gate is unlatched. (40 points)
- Turn on hindquarters while gate is opened. (25 points)
- Turn on hindquarters while gate is closed (25 points)
- Stand quietly parallel to gate, heels to hinge while gate is latched. (60 points)

**TOTAL 150 Points (minus time penalty)**

#### 4) Permit rider to lower rail, jump, replace rail & proceed. (20 seconds)

- Stand quietly while rail is lowered. (50 points)
- Jump quietly & cleanly (25 points)
- Stand quietly while rail is replaced. (50 points)

**TOTAL 125 points (minus time penalty)**

#### 5) Leave and return to field.

- Leave other horses promptly & quietly at designated gates. (5 points)
- Stand in marked area 30 seconds without moving feet. (25 points)
- Return to other horses quietly at designated pace. (20 points)

**TOTAL 50 points**

#### 6) Use of whip

- Skill (25 points)
- Behavior of horse (25 points)

**TOTAL 50 points**

#### 7) Master's choice - demonstrate skill designated by Master

**TOTAL 100 points**

**Subtract 50 points if ridden in a martingale**

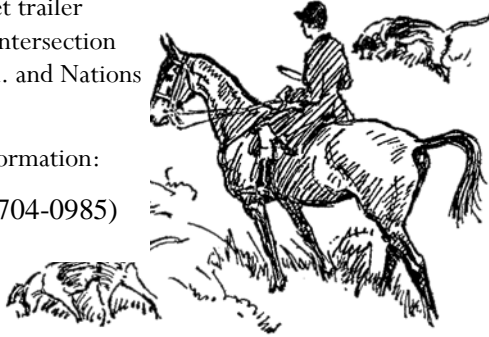
